



## Data on the LGBTQ+ Community

- Finding data on the queer community in the Caribbean is very difficult
- Government systems are not necessarily equipped to capture SOGIE minorities
- HIV programs capture data on MSM (Men who have Sex with Men) as they are deemed and high risk population. However, trans women also get lumped under this group even though they are twice as at risk to contracting HIV then Cisgender MSM
- The queer community does not disclose their identity and therefore that information will not be captured
- CSOs M&E capacity is low, or restricted to the projects that they are executing
