## Possible Action Points To Be Considered By Participants

- Consider encouraging your Government to submit 2022 Biennial Reports under the UN Programme of Action Addressing the Illicit Trade in Small Arms to United Nations Office of Disarmament Affairs
- Consider identifying steps still pending to be taken under the UNLIREC Caribbean Disarmament Road Map, as set out in UNLIREC presentation, and consider encouraging your Government to take those steps which you believe it should
- 3. Consider raising these matters, as appropriate, in your respective Parliamentary Committees and/or in possible interactions with relevant Ministries
- Consider reaching out to SALIENT to encourage closer/more frequent engagement with Parliamentarians, taking into account also points made by UNDP Representative on SALIENT at this Workshop
- 5. Consider encouraging your respective Governments to consider, in turn, joining innovative regional and international initiatives to better address arms trafficking
