The on-going war of aggression launched by the Russian Federation against Ukraine has reignited discussions on the **importance of universal accountability** in establishing justice, building sustainable peace, and upholding a rules-based international order. Central to this system is the **International Criminal Court (ICC)**, the sole permanent international jurisdiction with competence over the crime of genocide, crimes against humanity, war crimes, and the crime of aggression. The ICC's founding treaty, the Rome Statute, is instrumental in this endeavor, necessitating ratification and effective implementation at the domestic level.

Entered into force in 2002, significant progress has been made on the road towards global justice. Yet, **numerous challenges** still need to be overcome to achieve comprehensive global justice, including addressing valid criticism that have been formulated against the efficiency of the ICC. This begins with **increasing the number of ratifications of the Rome Statute system** (currently counting 123 States Parties to the ICC) and all of its amendments, implementing this vital instrument at the domestic level, enhancing the efficiency of the Court, and addressing threats that jeopardize its functioning, undermine its ability to carry out prosecutions, and pose a risk to the pursuit of global justice.

By fostering an **open dialogue among parliamentarians** from different regions of the world, this lunch event will **demystify the system of the Rome Statute**. It will address the challenges that need to be overcome, while emphasizing the importance of reaching universality of the system to promote global justice and sustainable peace.
