

In some parts of the world and under certain conditions, poverty may be a root cause of migration, whereas in other countries, under different conditions, the poor will frequently be the last to move. Similarly, in some areas, migration may be an escape route out of poverty while in others it contributes to an extension of poverty.

As an international organization, PGA has involved ixelf increasingly in the area of international migration and development, in particular over the past 2 years. The 27th Annual Forum in Dublin, Ireland focussed specifically on Migration, Immigration & Integration. PGA also participated in the High Level Dialogue on Migration and International Development at the United Nations in September 2006 and the aforementioned theme of the upcoming 29th PGA Annual Forum in Nigeria in November 2007 is a testimony to the priority we attach to this area of global concern.

The 29th Annual Forum is inviting members of approximately 150 Parliaments from around the world, as well as select governmental and inter-governmental officials, civil society representatives and academics to contribute to this uniquely important gathering.

We therefore look forward to your participation in this important international conference, which it is hoped will lead to a greater parliamentary mobilization to address the complex and multifaceted challenges resulting from contemporary trans-national migration flows. A concrete Plan of Action will be adopted by the Parliamentary Participants at the conclusion to the Annual Forum to ensure that momentum generated by the Forum is harnessed into actual follow-on initiatives/activities by Legislators upon return to their respective Parliaments.
