Discussion Topics:

- To discuss the need of implementing the UN Convention for People with Disabilities through domestic legislation;
- Identify gaps, needs and solutions regarding the design, delivery and funding of services and support through legislation:
 - a) health issues, namely in the workplace setting
 - → consider gender discrepancies
 - → access to information regarding communicable diseases and prevention such as HIV/AIDS
 - → reproductive health concerns
 - b) legal capacity (article 12 of convention) right to make one's own decision (including its implications for mental health law)
- Strategies to harmonize goals and activities between government bodies, legislators and civil society that address elimination of barriers for persons with disabilities;
- Disabilities resulting from conflicts situation and post-conflicts.
